Stunning Design Suggested for National American People Museum At Washington, DC's L'Enfant Plaza Overlook Site

The Coalition for the National Museum of the American People on May 3 released an architectural vision of the proposed National Museum of the American People that depicts what could become a major new Washington landmark at the end of L'Enfant Plaza, overlooking the Maine Avenue waterfront and the Washington Channel of the Potomac River.

The design concept developed by MTF A Architecture provides a sense of what this major new museum could look like on one of the sites in Washington designated as a location for a future museum by three federal agencies -- the National Park Service, National Capital Planning Commission and U.S. Commission of Fine Arts. The final selection of an architect will be made by the Museum once it is created and the Museum will work with federal agencies and Congress to obtain the best possible site.



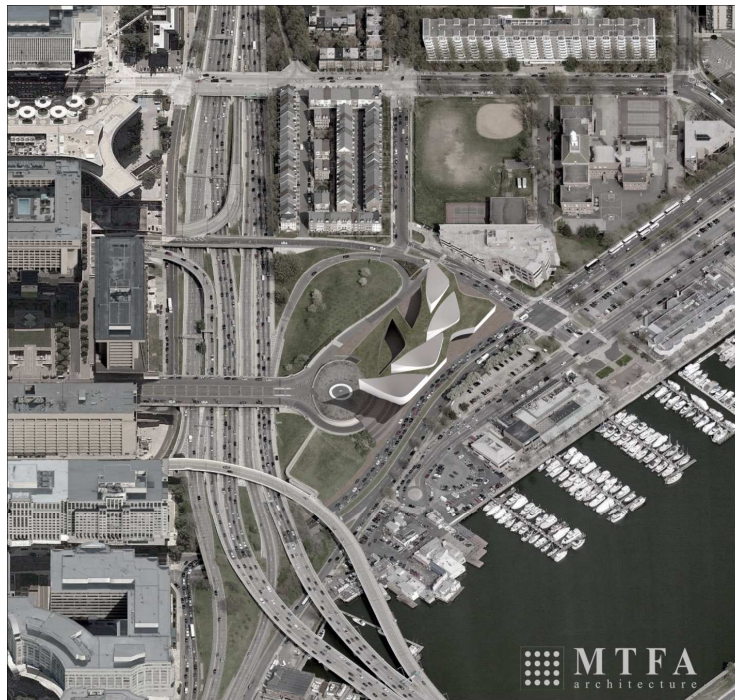
